Classroom management

According to Brophy (2006) "Classroom management refers to actions taken to create and maintain a learning environment conducive to successful instruction (arranging the physical environment, establishing rules and procedures, maintaining students' attention to lessons and engagement in activities)". Classroom management strategies are effective tool which teachers used to create proper learning environment, regulate students' behaviour and improve the relationship between teacher and students.

Classroom management focuses on three components,

- 1. Content management: Content management refers to the structuring and delivering educational materials and instruments in the classroom. Carefully selecting and sequencing the suitable instructional part of curriculum to make learning fruitful.
- **2. Conduct management:** Conduct management refers to the establishment of respectful and positive classroom environment where students feel valued, emotionally safe, respected, supported and empowered to learn. - **3. Covenant management:** Covenant management emphasizes on the active listening, open communication, authentic relationship of students. It also focuses on the meaningful and emotional relationship between teacher and students.

Behavior management
