Queer people have been forced to experience further isolation from others and from much-needed sources of sexual orientation and gender acceptance during the COVID-19 outbreak (Powell & Powell 2022). The study examined a sample of 1,500 Rex personal ads posted in the summer of 2020 that were submitted by users in the United States and included direct or indirect references to the coronavirus outbreak. The required SMS messages were saved and recorded by the researchers. Private text messages were then examined to learn more about the isolation that queer and non-cis people experience and the app's efforts to alleviate this isolation. "Modern gay bars" have been compared to Grindr, a well-known app designed for sexual minority men (Miller, 2015). The app emphasizes relocation and immediacy through the famous "zero feet" paradigm, allowing users to connect directly within minutes (Roth, 2016). Founded by Robin Exton and discussed and analysed in various studies, the creation of HER, formerly known as Dutch, is perhaps the most famous app for queer women. Dutch moved away from Grindle's focus on instant gratification to the idea that women wanted more progressive stories of desire. But when Axton pitched her app to a male-dominated start up, she ran into the common misconception that lesbians are a special and problematic consumer group. To assess the impact of dating apps on young gay, bisexual, transgender,

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and queer (YGBQTM) men, Gaudette et al. (2023) conducted a study in which they interviewed 28 health professionals who work with YGBQTM.

By analysing the data collected, they identified three categories of impacts with both positive and negative aspects.

1. The potential for sexual activity on gay dating apps is both transactional and pleasurable
2. Community development and safety improvements. This may coincide with increased exposure to rejection and discrimination.
3. Recognized increased sexual and drug-related risks associated with education, prevention, and intervention opportunities (Gaudette et al., 2023)

4. Impact on mental health

The swiping method is a distinctive factor that explains the popularity of dating apps. Swipe and scroll are addictive. Swipe right on profiles of people you find interesting and swipe left on profiles that don't meet your criteria. You can reject someone's profile by swiping with the left mouse button, but you still fear being rejected. When someone rejects us, our self-esteem goes down. Scrolling continues until you are satisfied, leading to excessive consumption of your phone. This can affect our daily activities and reduce productivity. These apps constantly show us an ideal version of our chosen partner, which can cause us self-esteem and body image issues. People who want to maintain a socially stereotyped ideal body type often suffer from eating disorders. The modes of evaluation (i.e., critically evaluating the profile) and modes of behaviour (i.e., making judgments based on intuition) were studied by Thomas et al. (2023), resulting in a study that interviewed 464 dating app users in the transitional age range (16-25 years). A moderated mediation study found that dating app use was associated with excessive page turning, which in turn was associated with a) upward social comparison, b) fear of loneliness, and c) excessive partner selection. In conclusion, frequent use of dating apps only had negative effects when accompanied by excessive swiping. Therefore, excessive swiping is detrimental to the well-being of young dating app users, regardless of the swiping method (Thomas et al., 2023). Neither slope nor travel mode moderated these correlations. The emphasis on physical beauty in the context of dating apps may represent appearance-related pressures that make people more likely to suffer from eating disorders and body dissatisfaction, thereby worsening the relationship between traits that predict ED and ED itself (Blake et al., 2022). An online survey measuring past-year dating app use and unhealthy weight control behaviours (UWCB) was completed by 1,769 people in the study sample. Based on the results of a multivariate logistic regression model, dating app users had significantly higher odds of UWCB than non-users (odds ratio [OR] range = 2.7 to 16.2). Results of an additional multivariate logistic regression analysis with gender stratification for women and men supported these findings (Tran et al., 2019). A study by Tyson et al. (2016) found that typically 50% of matches become unresponsive, which can lead to feelings of loneliness and being ignored. Another study by Strubel (2017) found that Tinder users, regardless of gender, reported significantly lower face and body satisfaction and higher levels of internalization, appearance comparison, body shame, and surveillance compared to non-users. In terms of self-esteem, male Tinder users scored significantly lower than male or female non-Tinder users. Our findings suggest that Tinder represents a contemporary environment of appearance pressure, that its use is associated with a variety of negative body and self-images, and that people are increasingly likely to internalize appearance ideals and compare them to others (Strudel, 2017).
